Liberty Station held a crime prevention social for its residents on Tuesday July 16th. This event marks the final phase and completion of the property as an International Crime Free Association certified crime free multi-housing unit. Liberty Station is the first complex to be completely certified as an ICFA Multi-Housing property in Heber City. It is also the first property in Utah to receive this notable recognition. Kudos go to Dawnna Patten of Liberty Station/Cowboy Properties for her efforts in completing the certification process.

The youths and adults viewed a presentation in crime prevention and internet safety. Councilmen Bradshaw and McDonald

represented the city in awarding the official certificate. Dawnna Patten and Holly Sanford accepted the award for Liberty Station and Cowboy Properties.

The Crime Free Multi-Housing Program is a state-of-the-art, crime prevention program designed to reduce crime, drugs, and gangs on apartment properties. This international program focuses on training property managers in appropriate screening of applicants, the eviction process, compliance with federal, state and local health and safety standards regarding rental properties, and fostering increased communication between the city officials, police departments, and property management.

Heber City held its first training session in Crime Free Multi-Housing practices for property managers

in April. Seven individuals attended this training, representing four multi-housing organizations within the city. Crime Free programs are also available for hotels/motels, condominiums, mobile home parks, and single rental homes. While attending the Utah Ordinance Compliance Association Conference earlier this year, Heber City Code Compliance Officer, Ramona Pace, was trained in Crime Free Multi-Housing.
